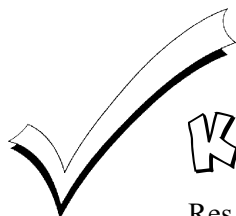

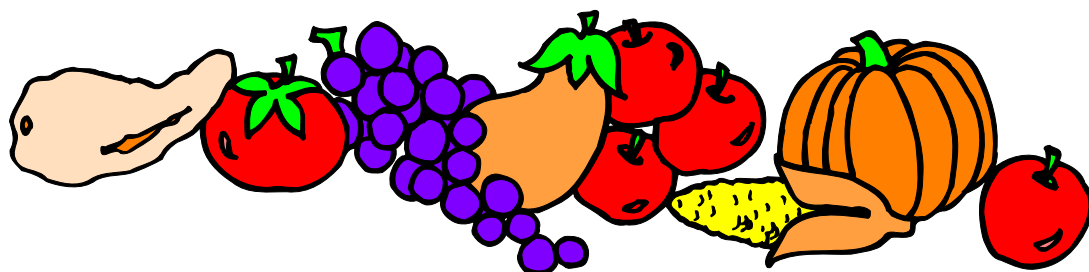

Walk-in Advising

Walk-In advising hours allow you to see an advisor without an appointment. However, there is often a wait due to the number of students who show up.

PROCESS:

1. You must sign up in person for walk-in hours. For morning walk-in hours, signups begin at 9:00am; for afternoons, signups begin at 1:00pm.
2. Students are seen in the order they arrive.
3. If you leave, you will lose your place in line.

PLEASE NOTE signing in does not guarantee you will be seen, particularly if you sign in close to the end of walk-in hours.

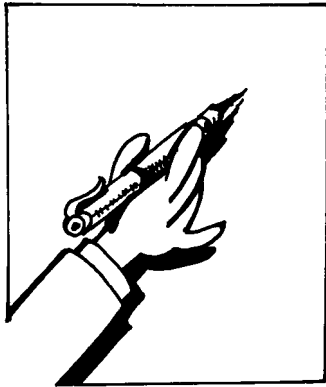

Undergraduate Research Fellowships

Crown has developed a new program to encourage student-faculty interaction through undergraduate research. Up to 8 Research Fellowships of \$800 each will be awarded for 2003-04 to juniors and seniors. Half of the money will be provided as a fellowship to the student and the other half will be provided to the faculty member's research account. Recycling

UCSC has a commitment to the City of Santa Cruz to cut back on the amount of trash produced. Recycling saves both energy and resources, and lessens environmental damage that would otherwise occur to make products from raw materials. There are recycling bins around the college for the following items and all containers should be empty for health and safety reasons. Containers with food still in them can rot and mold, causing allergic reactions and illnesses for the workers at recycling plants.

Here's what to recycle:

- * Aluminum and Steel cans, metal jar lids.
- * Glass bottles and jars (No pyrex, mirrors, ceramic, lightbulbs or window glass)
- * Newspaper/Magazines (but not office paper)
- * Plastic bottles (No foam or plastic bags. Plastic bags can be reused, or recycled by returning them to Safeway)

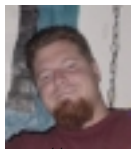
Thanksgiving Break

Update your address

Do not assume that every office on campus has your correct address. To be sure that we have the correct information, you should update your address on the Student Portal (<http://students.ucsc.edu/>) by clicking the Change Address link on the title bar. You can then update your addresses so they will be current.

√ **Next of Kin:** Many students have not entered their Next of Kin information at the Student Portal. This is the person the university would contact if a student were involved in an accident or other emergency situation.

√ **College Address:** Mailings to your college mailbox include routine enrollment verifications, most financial aid correspondence, grade reports, narrative evaluations, Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) notifications and urgent messages from campus offices during the academic year.

√ **Local Address:** This is your current address. Statements of account are mailed to your local address (may be your college mailbox) unless you establish a separate billing address. Other mailings to your local address include refund checks and urgent messages and general mailings from campus units. Note that your local address is public information.

√ **Permanent Address:** This is an address where mail can always reach you. It may be the same as your local address or the address of a relative but not a college address. This address is used for mailing diplomas (4-6 months after your graduation date). During the summer, the permanent address is used for important mailings UNLESS a summer address is provided.

√ **Summer Address:** In spring quarter students are reminded to provide a summer mailing address to the College for use in forwarding mail (and to send important notifications during the summer months). If no summer address is provided, mail arriving at the college will be returned to the sender.

√ **Billing Address:** This address is used for statements of account ONLY. It is established and updated only by the student and only at Student Business Services, 203 Hahn

Check your email

Every new and continuing student has been assigned a UCSC account this year. It is essential that you activate your account as this is the only way some departments and individuals will contact you and you are responsible for knowing the information sent. If you have not yet activated your account, go to the following website to do so: <http://www2.ucsc.edu/cats/sc/services/accounts/acct-cats-student.shtml>. You will need to know your student ID and PIN to register. If you have any questions see the Instructional Computing website at <http://ic.ucsc.edu>.
